GUIDELINES FOR CHOOSING THE TYPE OF LICENCE

All authors of doctoral theses have intellectual property rights which may be exercised in the manner they deem appropriate to defend their interests. You can choose one of the following alternatives when authorising the dissemination of the thesis through the TDX cooperative repository and the UJI repository:

1. "All rights reserved" (copyright).

Anyone wishing to use the doctoral thesis must ask for the author's express permission, except in the cases stipulated by the Intellectual Property Law (such as a private copy or citation rights).

2. Reserving only part of the rights through a Creative Commons licence (CC).

This is a licensing system that means that the doctoral thesis can be copied, distributed and publicly communicated, provided that authorship is acknowledged. When choosing one of these licences, the author permits certain uses without the need for a specific request. Applying for CC licences is completely free and you do not need to register the doctoral thesis in any specific CC repository.

You can choose from the following Creative Commons licences:

- Attribution (BY): others can use your original work and possible derivatives of it; building upon it and distribution are permitted without any restriction.
- Attribution-NonCommercial (BY-NC) lets others produce derivative works for non-commercial uses. The original work may also not be used for commercial purposes.
- Attribution-NonCommercial-ShareAlike (BY-NC-SA) does not permit commercial use of the original work or any possible derivative works. The distribution must be with the same licence as the one covering the original work.
- Attribution-NonCommercial-No Derivs (BY-NC-ND) does not permit commercial use of the original work or the production of any derivative works.
- Attribution-ShareAlike (BY-SA) permits commercial use of the original work and any possible derivative works. The distribution must be with the same licence as the one covering the original work.
- Attribution-NoDerivs (BY-ND) permits commercial use of the original work but does not permit production of any derivative works.
