For the March 2022 session, you must have graduated by the mid June-July 2021

I am a 5th grade law student - in my country

legal studies are organised as per Bologna system but despite having completed 4 years of studies and over 250 ECTS - I don't hold a Bachelor's degree. Is it possible to apply for traineeship?



Even though you have more than the minimum (180) credits, you need to have completed an actual degree before applying



Are you eligible?

Very good knowledge of at least 2 EU official languages of which one should be a working language (English, French or German)

Mother tongue	No proof required	
	language certificates with attainment showing level C	
Other languages	university diplomas/transcripts obtained in the languages in question	
	proof of bilingual education at secondary level

No age limit


